Assignment briefing and mapping to unit:

1000 word educational resource for Access students.

An educational resource for Access students. 2 sides of A4 using colour, a piece of work that:

1. Side One

- a. Explains the characteristics of Macbeth as a Shakespearean Tragedy (1.1)
- b. Analyses the form of Macbeth in relation to Aristotle's "Aesthetics." (1.2)

2. Side 2

- a. Explains the characteristics of "The Story of an Hour," by Kate Chopin as a modern short story (1.1)
- b. Analyses the form of "The Story of an Hour" in relation to Freytag's Pyramid (1.2)

The resource will explain on Side One the main characteristics Macbeth shares with Aristotle's definition of Tragedy in "Aesthetics" and some ways in which it departs from them. Also on Side One you will analyse the form of Macbeth in relation to metre and structure, but you may also do this in relation to staging considerations and their influence on the form the play takes.

The resource will explain on Side 2 the main characteristics of "The Story of an Hour" as a modern short story and elements where it may resemble or differ from other types of short story. Also you will analyse the form of "The Story of an Hour" in relation to Freytag's Pyramid.

Your work will contain skilful use of images, text, quotation and citations where needed.

Your submission will contain a word count, audience description and bibliography on a separate cover sheet.
