Principles of Assessment

Valid	Getting the right assessment. The assessment will measure what it claims to measure; there will be a close fit between the assessment and the learning outcome.		
Reliable	Getting the assessment right. The assessment result will be replicable under different circumstances or with a different tutor.		
Fit for purpose	Assessment will be appropriate for the curriculum and the learners.		
Inclusive	Assessment will be equitable and will be designed to allow all learners to achieve regardless of their history or cultural differences.		
Sufficient	Provides enough evidence to demonstrate achievement of the unit and gives details of the depth of an assessment method, e.g. a written report of 500 words.		
Authentic	Evidence presented is the learner's own work.
